From Dr. Prince...

Vacation Bible School (VBS) begins this coming Monday! It's one of my favorite ministries of the year. Children fill our buildings and learn about Jesus. Some of them don't know anything about Jesus or the Bible. So it's a great opportunity to impact children and families in our community!

Please pray for VBS this week as our many volunteers and I share the story of Jesus with the children who are here. Pray that these kids will make life-changing commitments to Christ this week. Pray that we'll be able to reach families who aren't involved in church, so they can know Christ!

Last week, the big news coming out of the Southern Baptist Convention (SBC) was about the resolution that passed, but almost didn't! Each year, the SBC in its annual session passes resolutions on various topics. These resolutions aren't binding on anyone, but reflect the feelings of people attending the meeting.

This year, Dwight McKissic, African-American pastor of Cornerstone Baptist Church in Arlington, Texas, and former SBC officer, presented to the Resolutions Committee a strong resolution condemning racism in general and the alt-right in particular. Many Americans don't know about the alt-right. It's an extreme conservative movement that promotes division and racism.

The Resolutions Committee failed to take McKissic's resolution to the convention for approval. When McKissic asked why, they gave several reasons, including that the resolution was poorly written. This grieved McKissic and many others attending the convention, and resulted in several tumultuous sessions. When McKissic and others tried to have the SBC vote on it anyway, his resolution failed to achieve the two-thirds majority it needed to pass. It seemed for a time that the SBC was going to adjourn under the cloud of a failure to condemn racism and affirm African-American Southern Baptists.

Finally, the Resolutions Committee came out with a watered-down version of McKissic's resolution. It still opposed racism and the alt-right, but not in the strong terms of the original resolution. The SBC bent its rules, and resolution passed. Thus the SBC narrowly avoided leaving their meeting under the cloud of failing to condemn racism.

It's great that the SBC condemned racism and the alt-right, but it's bad that it was so difficult to do and that it watered down McKissic's original resolution. It shows that we still have work to do on the issue of race in our Baptist circles.

May we always preach a gospel in which are all equal at the foot of the cross.
