

As has become our tradition, we plan to serve free water and ice cream to the families who participate in the Children's Bicycle Parade. Vacation Bible School is always a great activity, and this year we're trying something new. Our sessions will be on four successive Wednesday evenings beginning on July 10. You can do four things to help with VBS this

First, **pray**. Pray the Lord will use us to show Christ's love to the children and families of our community.

Second, **volunteer**. We need all kinds of helpers. Contact Seth Wright and let him know how you can help.

Third, **invite**. Invite all children you know to participate.

Fourth, give. Give generous financial gifts so we can have the resources to reach families!

In July, we also plan to begin to have discussions about entering the "Helping Churches Thrive" effort. A few weeks ago, Andy Hale from CBFNC shared with us about this emphasis. In this effort, we'll focus on six key characteristics of thriving churches:

Committed to authentic community.

Flexible

Collaborate as partners locally and globally

Cultivate leaders

Intergenerational

Being Formed

To participate in this effort, we'll need to form a team of at least 8 church members that will commit to training at a retreat in September. Team members will need to commit to being part of a video conference once a month with other churches going through the same process. We'll also need to commit to devoting one worship service a month to one of the characteristics listed above, along to having one general church dialog each

It's been about 13 years since we had our coaching process with Eddie Hammett, so this would be a good time to think and pray about developing our church's health.

Watch What You Say...


You may have noticed some new language coming from the pulpit on Sundays. Recently, I have made the effort to say, *Please rise in body or in spirit*, at the times when the congregation typically stands. I first heard this invitation at a conference where one of the foci was the church and serving people suffering from any impairment or disability. I was struck by how just a slight change in verbiage opens who is invited to worship. Indeed, all are welcome in worship, but not everyone has the ability to stand on Sundays, and some may not have the emotional strength to rise. Asking them to stand can be insensitive to their needs. Their very presence is worship enough on those days.

Another phrase that I have offered nearly every week is the closing words, Go in Peace and Serve our Lord. I heard this every Sunday of my undergraduate career. Spending a lot of time in the Lutheran church during that season, this phrase became a regular part of my worship language. The pastor would always say, Go in Peace and Serve our Lord. The Lutheran church reminds their congregations that as they leave their place of worship, they are entering the mission field. As they exit the "safety" of the sanctuary, they are also sent out with the peace that only God and provide. It's subtle, but it is a constant reminder that we do not enter the world alone or without purpose.

Our worship words are meaningful, powerful statements that remind us and the world of who we are and whose we are. A mentor of mine said often, "say what you mean, and mean what you say."

A reminder to the choristers or anyone else interested, that during the month of July our Adult choir will meet at **9:15am on Sundays in the choir room**. This allows us to serve during VBS and maintain our choir during this exciting time of ministry and outreach.
