

Haywood Pathways and Holy Cow Food





From Dr. Prince...

Our church bylaws delineate what happens when a pastor leaves our church. It addresses two main areas: the selection the most "traditional" times in the church and secular of Pastor Search Team and the calling of an interim pastor.

The bylaws say the church shall elect a Pastor Search Team consisting of 5 members and 1 alternate. The election is to take place over 2 Sundays. On the first Sunday, each church member shall have the opportunity to nominate up to 5 church members to serve on the team. The deacons are to collect and count the nominations. Two weeks later, the deacons will present to the church the ten members receiving the most nominations. Church members will then have the opportunity to vote for five to serve on the team. The five receiving the most votes will be on the team, and the person coming in sixth will be the alternate.

When I announced my retirement to the deacons in November, I encouraged them to go ahead and form the search team and have it begin its work before I retire. They agreed. So, our day for nomination for the Pastor Search Team will be January 12 and the day of the election will be January 26.

The other role the deacons have is to select an interim pastor. They will begin working on that when the time of my retirement comes nearer.

As we go into this time of transition, I ask you to pray for three things. First, pray for the formation of this search team. Prav about whom God would have you to nominate to serve. Second, pray for the person God is leading to serve as pastor to this church. Third, pray for Trish and me as we make this big transition in life. I've served continuously as a church pastor for 44 years. This will be a big change for us!

Still lots of good things to do here before I retire. I'm looking forward to seeing what God will do among us in the coming months!

As we begin our season of holy expectation, I invite you to pray with me: O Holy Child of Bethlehem, descend to us we pray. Cast out our sin and enter in, be born in us today. As we hear the Christmas angels and the great glad tidings they tell, Come to us, abide with us, Our Lord Immanuel.

May this season be a time of holy imagination, as we wait for the coming of Christ, the Prince of Peace.
